OCSL PLAYING UP PERMIT

Players playing at a higher level *within their own club only*, must complete this form. Players using an "OCSL PLAYING UP PERMIT " **MUST also possess a signed player ID book or card**, validated (for the current year) by the EODSA Registrar. This signed player ID book or card must be present at the game in order for the process of card checking to take place. Failure to present a signed player ID book or card shall render the player ineligible to play. **This completed form is to be submitted to the game official along with the game sheet.**

Please see section V PLAYING UP and PLAYING ON TRIAL in OCSL Rules and regulations for full rules. This is a summary only and is not complete.

A properly filled out and signed Play Up form **MUST** be given to the game official or else the game may be forfeit and possible fines incurred (XI.3)

No youth competitive player can play up to Senior recreational. (V4iii)

A player can play up a **TOTAL** of 3 times without having to be registered to the higher level team. If they play up a 4th time after Roster freeze (July 31) then the player is ineligible.

A maximum of 3 players can be called up at one time. If you are a Competitive team review the rules for exceptions.

See table below for quick reference. A player can play up to any division that is higher on the table than their highest registered team.

Notes:

- A player can only play up from their highest registered team.
 - A player registered to MP can only register in OT1. This player cannot play up to any other team.
 - A player who is registered to OT1 and MC3 can play up to MC2, MC1 and MP if the opportunity arises.
- For all play ups, the relevant form is required.
- You cannot play across the levels.
 - A player cannot play up between OT1 and MR1.
- Under no circumstances is a player allowed to play down.
- When dealing with any age specific categories play ups are still required to satisfy the age requirement.
- Women can play up on men’s teams but men cannot play on women’s teams.
- Should any of these situations occur the player will be considered ineligible.
 - Any team playing an ineligible player will be subject to corrective action in addition to the forfeiture of points according to the published rules.

W30+ and Masters (50+):

In accordance with OSA published rules, the OCSL will allow for players registered to teams in W30+ and Masters (50+) to be permitted to play for another OCSL team in which the player is not registered. Players in W30+ and Masters (50+) may only play a total of 3 times on teams in which they are not registered.

In accordance with OSA published rules, the OCSL will allow for players registered to OCSL Recreational teams to be permitted to play for a W30+ and Masters (50+) team, provided they qualify by age, and in which the player is not registered. OCSL recreational players may only play a total of 3 times on teams in which they are not registered.

With each occurrence, the player is obligated to submit the appropriate permit at game time. Should a player not submit the completed permit, they will be considered ineligible.

- Any team playing an ineligible player will be subject to corrective action in addition to the forfeiture of points according to the published rules.
